This Is Scouting is an introductory session that highlights the values, aims, history, funding and methods of Scouting. It addresses how these aims and methods are reached at an age-appropriate style within Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting Varsity Scouting and Venturing. It's available on-line at the training web page, and it takes about 40 minutes. Ideally, all unit-based volunteers — Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Varsity Scout and Venturing leaders — take this session when they join so they understand that they are all striving for the same results with the youth they serve. Each leader completes *This Is Scouting* training only once. Leaders should also take **Fast Start Orientation** and **Youth Protection Training** at <http://olc.scouting.org>.



Next is the **Introduction to Cub Scouting FUN!** It's focused on teaching the new leader just how easy and fun Cub Scouting can be! **Cub Scout Leader Position-Specific Training** gets you up to speed in your new Cub Scout position. It's for a new leader, or a leader in a new position. It is offered for Tiger Den Leaders, Cub Scout Den Leaders, Webelos Den Leaders, Cubmasters, Pack Committee Members, and Pack Trainers. Assistant should take the training for the position they are assisting.

Once you have completed **Fast Start Orientation, Youth Protection Training, This Is Scouting, Introduction to Cub Scouting FUN!** and **Cub Scout Leader Position-Specific Training** for your position, you are a Trained Cub Scout leader and can wear the **Trained** patch for your position!

Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters also need to take **Fast Start Orientation, Youth Protection Training**, and **This Is Scouting** at <http://olc.scouting.org>. Next, **Scoutmaster Leader Specific Training** and the **Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills** complete basic training. Next SMLST: Nov.6. IOLS: Nov. 13-14. Troop Committee Challenge training for Boy Scout troop committee members better understand their role in delivering the promise in support of the troop, the Scoutmaster and the Scouts. Like the other on-line courses, it is available at <http://olc.scouting.org>. This training can also be delivered to all of the troop committee at once. It should also include the Scoutmaster and, if possible, Assistant Scoutmasters.



Troop committee members who complete **Fast Start Orientation, Youth Protection Training, This Is Scouting,** and **Troop Committee Challenge** training are qualified as Trained Boy Scout Leaders, making them eligible to wear the **Trained** patch for their position.

The **Venture Leader Specific Training** was developed for Venturing Advisors, assistant Advisors, and crew committee members. This course takes one evening. Once the on-line courses are completed, the leader is considered to be trained. Contact the Training Committee at training@vhcbsa.org to arrange for basic training for your leaders.
