

CAMP VERDUGO OAKS FIRE RULES

When fires are permitted the following rules apply to open fires, propane fires, and charcoal. There has been occasion when ALL forms of flames have been not allowed in camp. That has been rare but please check the week before your trip. We are under fire restrictions set by the Angeles National Forest. Be prepared.

1. No flammable liquids are allowed in camp at any time. This includes liquid charcoal starter. Scouts will find that in the Guide to Safe Scouting it is prohibited. Charcoal chimneys are available from the campmaster
2. If charcoal cooking is allowed you can be done in the following areas:

Concrete pads in campsites

Bare dirt areas with 10' clearance in a container 8" off the ground

Slab and BBQ area in front of lodge. The slabs at KYBOs and bathrooms may not be used,

3. When you use a concrete slab for Dutch oven cooking you must put 4 layers of foil down under the charcoal to assist with the removal and disposal of ash.
4. Once a campfire or charcoal fire is started there must be an adult fire tender in attendance at all times. You must have 2 buckets standing by, one with water the other with sand. A shovel will need to be standing by. If you forgot these items talk with campmaster there are a few available.
5. Campfires must be contained in the fire rings in each campsite. Flames should never get more the 8" to 10" inches above the fire.
6. Fires must be dead out before going to bed and when closing your campsite.
7. When packing up your campsite the dead out ash needs to be cleaned out of the fire pit. Campmaster will supply shovel and wheel barrel and instructions where the ash goes. Ash cannot be put in garbage bags.
8. Thank you for providing your own firewood/charcoal for your needs.
9. BSA standard fire safety practices will be observed at all times.
10. The campfire bowl fires are propane, do not put wood, leaves or any other combustible materials. If you have reserved the campfire bowl please confirm your times with the campmaster. The campmaster lite and turn off fire.
11. If the campmaster decides the winds are too high fires will not be allowed.
12. Campfires are restricted to the fire danger as designated by the forest service do not ask campmaster to make a change.
